

Rules and Regulations for Camp Success

Alcohol & Firearms

- Firearms may be possessed on the campground only in compliance with state and federal laws and regulations.
- No firearms, fireworks, air rifles, or any other such weapons may be discharged.
- State law permits alcohol use only in private areas (inside a cabin or camping unit) or in areas designated on permits issued by the Virginia Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control. There shall be no public consumption of alcoholic beverages in the campground.

Dogs

- Owners or handlers shall be required to have their dog(s) on a leash and under control at all times. Any dog displaying aggressive behavior shall be removed from the campground immediately.
- Owners or handlers shall not allow their dog(s) to damage the grounds or bark excessively as to be a nuisance to other campground visitors. All waste shall be picked up and disposed of properly.
- Owners or handlers shall bear the legal responsibility for any injury or damages caused by their dog(s).
- Owners or handlers shall show, upon request, proof of a valid license.

Fires

- Campfires are permitted only within an appropriate fire ring not to exceed 30" diameter.
- Bonfires are only allowed under strict permit from the Town.
- All fires shall be attended at all times and extinguished upon leaving the campground.

Grounds & Vegetation

- Campers shall be required to choose the campsite with the greenest grass in an effort to keep the negative impact to the vegetation at the campground to a minimum.
- Campers shall not dig any holes or set up horseshoe pits in the campground.
- No personal shall cut, break, pluck or in any way injure or deface the trees, shrubs, plants, turf, fences, statuary, buildings or structures. No signs, swings, play devices, or related hardware (ropes, wires, nails, etc.) shall be attached to any tree. Trees and shrubs shall not be climbed or hung on, nor shall they be used as poles for game nets or swings.
- All grills and other heat-generating equipment shall not be placed near any tree trunks or under the branches of any tree.
- Placement of picnic tables within 100 feet of the borders of New River and/or Wolf Creek is prohibited.
- Campgrounds are declared to be public infrastructure and no persons other than those authorized by the town manager shall dig, remove, destroy, injure, mutilate or cut any trees, plants, shrubs, blooms, flowers, or any portion of the vegetation growing in the campground except by approval of the town manager.

Litter/Garbage/Waste Disposal

- All litter and garbage shall be disposed of properly in the waste receptacles located throughout the campground. Campers shall police their campsite for litter and garbage inadvertently left on the grounds before final departure.
- No person(s) shall bring non-campground generated garbage or trash into the campground for the purpose of discarding or disposing of such.
- All wastewater shall be disposed of properly and according to health code regulations.

Miscellaneous

- Disorderly conduct, abusive language, and any violation of the rules and regulations as set forth in this policy shall be grounds for immediate ejection without refund from the campground.
- No peddling, soliciting or commercial enterprise is permitted on campground property without written approval from council.
- Children under twelve years of age shall not be left unattended at the campground. Campers are responsible for the conduct of and any damage caused by their legal dependents or other minors in their care.
- The Town, its representatives, and its employees shall not be responsible for accidents, injuries, or loss of property by fire, theft, wind, flood or other natural acts which are beyond their control. All equipment furnished with the campground is solely for the convenience of the user and shall be utilized at the risk of the user.
- Campers shall be responsible for the actions of their visitor(s).
- The hitting of golf balls in the campground is prohibited.
- Feeding and/or handling of wildlife are prohibited at the campground.
- Access to the boat landing at the campground shall remain open at all times.
- All roads shall remain open and accessible at all times.
- The rules and regulations for the campground are subject to amendment by the Narrows Town Council.

Noise

- Campers shall refrain from excessive noise between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. Activities such as listening to the radio, playing games, etc., except for inside of the tent at a reasonably low volume, are prohibited during this time frame.

Special Events

- Any person or group wishing to use the campground for a special event shall be required to obtain a permit at least 30 days prior to the date of the event.
- For private events requiring that no other campers be present, a fee of \$200.00 will be charged in an effort to offset the lost revenue.

Permits

- All persons wishing to use the campground, whether for overnight camping or another use, shall be required to obtain a permit.
- Any person wishing to stay at the campground for more than 14 consecutive days shall be required to obtain a new permit after the initial 14-day time period is reached and to move to another campsite area.

- Any person wishing to use the campground as a place for a display, sign, etc. shall be required to obtain a permit. All such displays and signs are required to be free-standing.
- Permits may be obtained at the Narrows Town Office. For persons wishing to use the campground during the weekend, a permit shall be obtained by 4:00 p.m. on Friday.
- Personnel authorized by the town manager shall randomly check campground visitors for permits.
- The appropriate fee shall be paid at the Narrows Town Office upon obtaining a permit. Refunds shall not be given after permits are issued.
- Permit Fees: Tents—\$5.00 per night per tent or \$20.00 per week per tent (5 days). Persons wishing to use the campground for reasons other than overnight camping will not be charged a fee.
- Any person found to be in violation of the rules and regulations for the campground will have their permit revoked and will be removed from campground property. Repeat violators shall be subject to being banned from the campground indefinitely.

Vehicles

- All vehicle operators shall maintain a maximum safe speed of 10 miles per hour.
- Careless operation of motorized or non-motorized vehicles shall be ground for removal from the campground and/or issue of a citation from a law enforcement officer.
- Any operation of a golf cart, four wheelers, or other recreational utility vehicle shall not be permitted at the campground.
